CNM is found in both field and conformation Labradors in the United States, Canada and the United Kingdom as well as Germany, France, Sweden, and many other countries globally. Research has confirmed that the disease is identical in all countries. CNM used to be called Hereditary Myopathy of the Labrador Retriever (HMLR), Autosomal Recessive Myopathy (ARMD), Type II deficiency Myopathy, Labrador Muscular Myopathy and other names.
